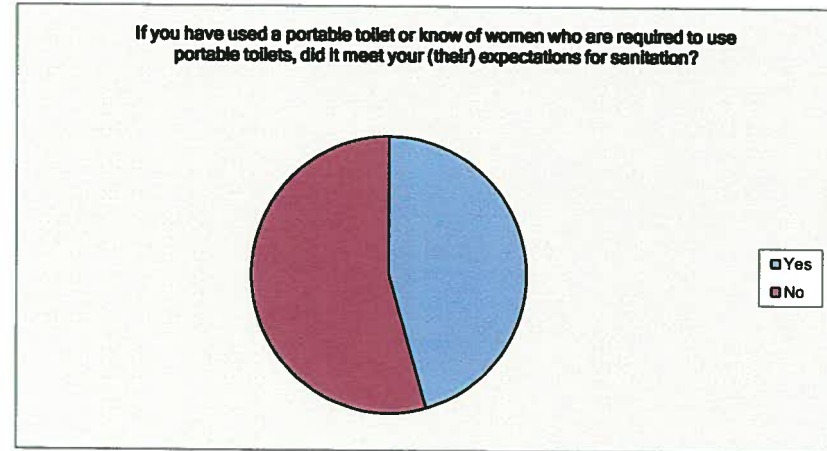

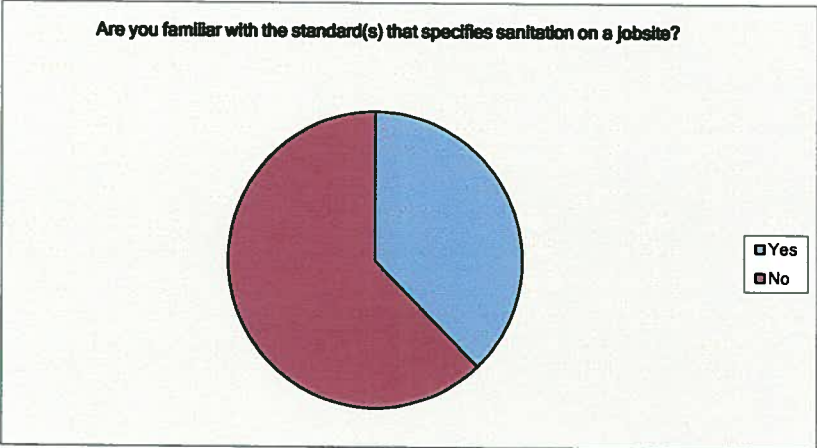

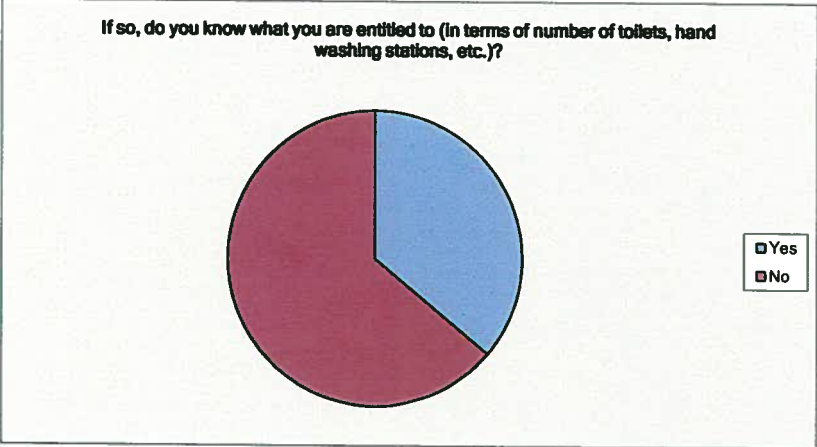

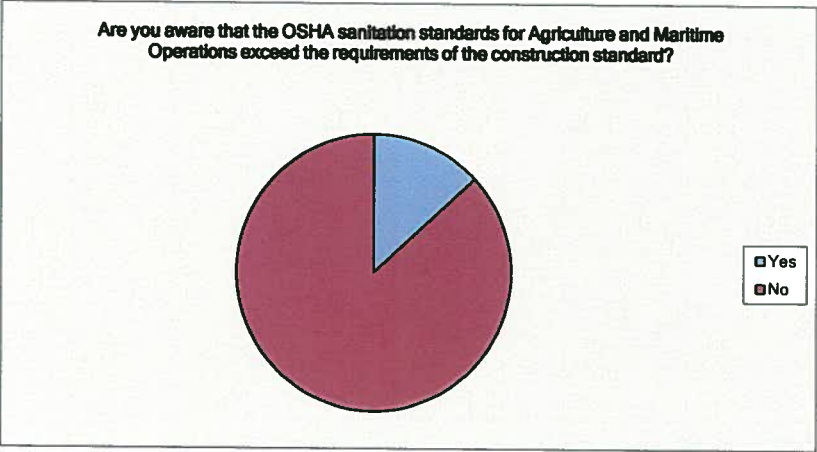

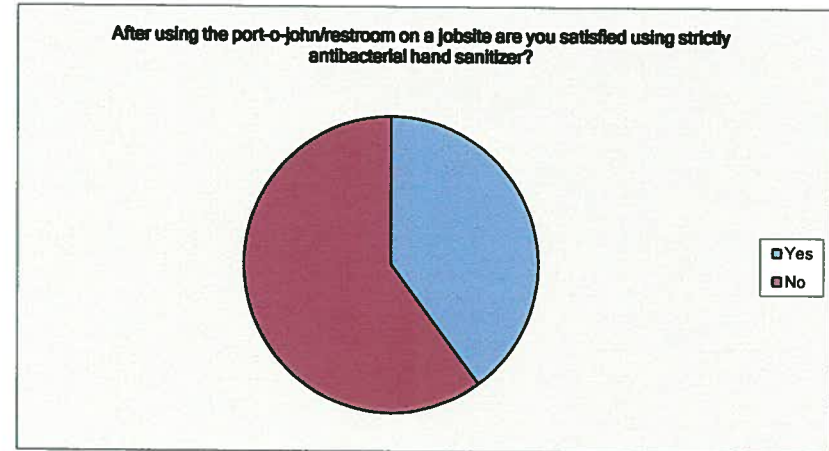

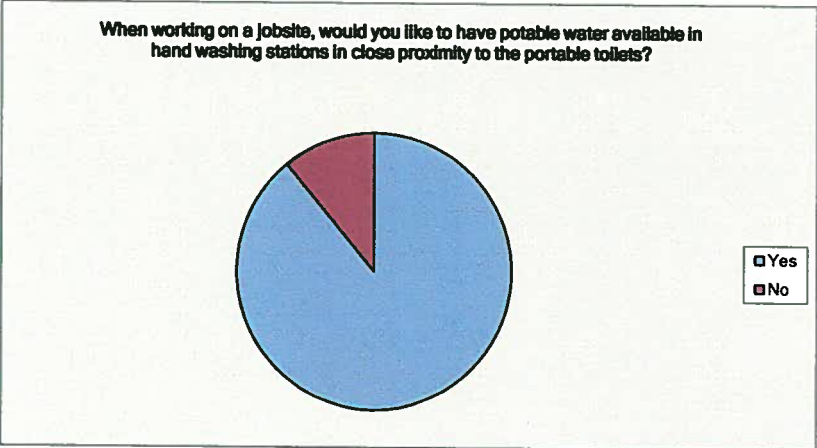

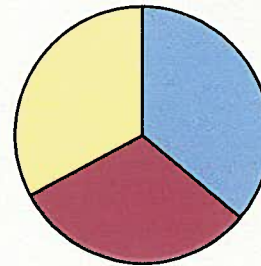

Do you believe that men would like to have potable water available in hand washing stations in close proximity to the portable toilets?

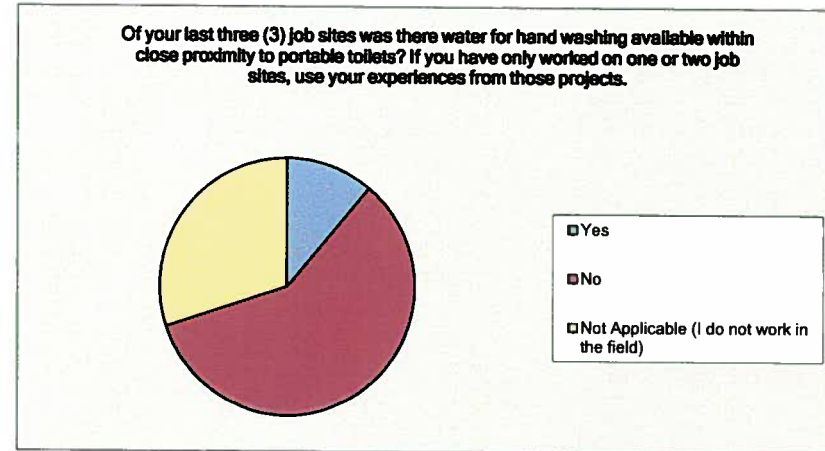

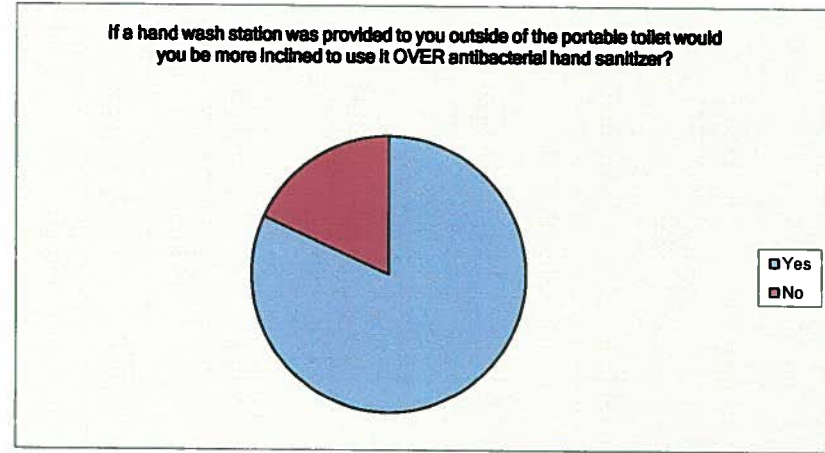

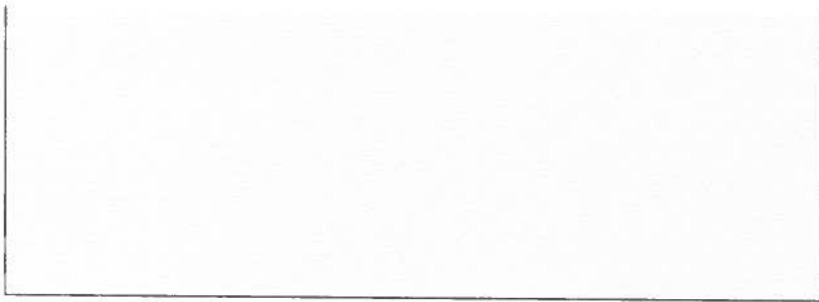
Did the portable toilet have adequate means to accept your personal hygiene product(s)?

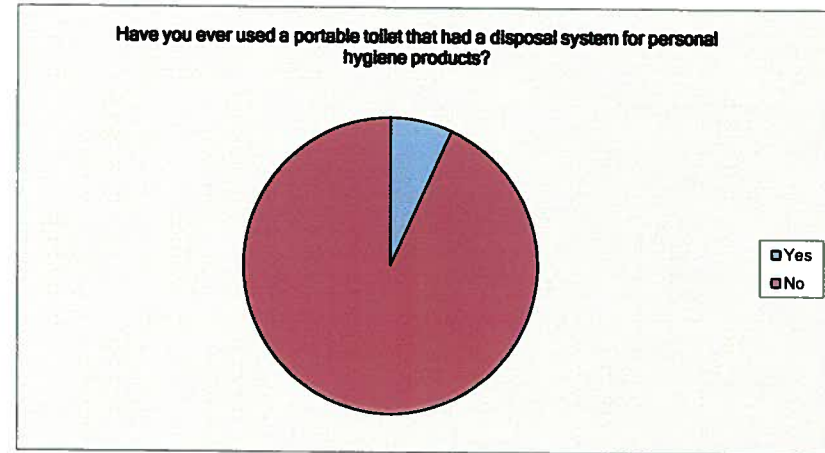

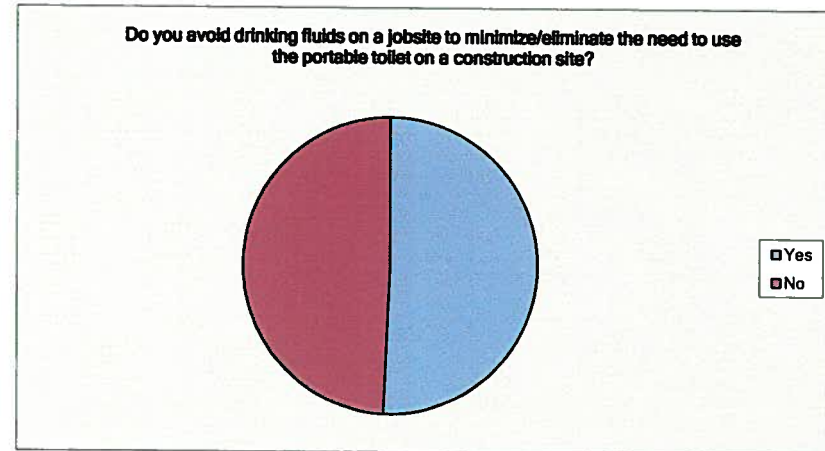

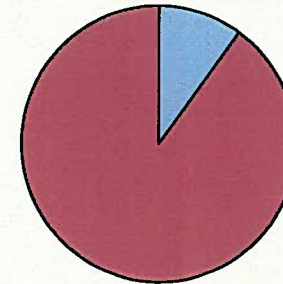

In my opinion, enforcing that hand sanitizer be available is the more economical option - and probably the more sanitary option - over a handwashing station with potable water. Not only does the temporary water and sewer lines required for a handwashing station add cost, but the trash debris from paper towels adds to a messy jobsite, and the majority of the workers probably aren't going to wash their hands the full 20-30 seconds required for adequate handwashing. Hand sanitizer is easy to use, results in little mess, and is more likely to contribute to more sanitary conditions on a jobsite.
